The programs, Rolfing® Structural Integration 600 hour program and 731 hour program, prepare students to enter occupations specific to the application of Rolfing SI, a brand of structural integration. Rolfing SI is manual bodywork that works on the entire body by manipulating the *fascia* - the tissue that connects muscle to joints and bones. Rolfing SI works with this web-like complex of connective tissues to release, realign and balance the whole body. Graduates of these Rolfing SI programs become Certified Rolfers™ qualified to treat clients on an individual basis in private or clinic-based offices.

Students who complete our program become independent practitioners in private practice. As part of the certification program, we provide information and education regarding practice building, small business development and marketing. We also provide resources to support graduates in becoming successful practitioners of Rolfing Structural Integration and as independent small business owners. These resources include, but are not limited to, international web presence, use of the registered trademarks, individual guidance and regularly updated resources for practice development. Since most of our graduates choose to practice outside of the local area, we do not provide traditional job placement services, yet we do provide clients for all students in our teaching clinics throughout the training.

Generally, **greater than 80% of graduates are able to support themselves with a full-time practice within 12 months of graduation.** Practice size is contingent upon various factors including, but not limited to, marketing and outreach efforts, local demand, professional affiliations, and scope of practice.
